June 6 – Gary Terry "Follow Your Dreams" 125 August 8 – Kalamazoo Klash XXVI The 2018 Monster Energy NASCAR Cup schedule was published on May 23 and Kalamazoo Speedway answered by announcing its 2018 dates for the two premier Outlaw Super Late Model events. In 2017 the two events will gain additional notoriety as part of the Outlaw Super Late Model touring series of 6 top events at 5 Midwest tracks boasting a \$20,000 point fund sponsored by Sweet Manufacturing. But before we move to 2018, let's highlight the 2017 races.

In 2017, Tyler Roahrig will go for two in a row for the sophomore running of the Gary Terry "Follow Your Dreams" 125, presented by GT Products. Roahrig racked up wins in just about every big Outlaw Super Late Model race in 2016 and started out strong in 2017 by winning the Intimidator 100 at the Speedway on opening night. The 2017 Gary Terry "Follow Your Dreams" 125 will take place on Wednesday, June 14. Practice is the day before on June 13 and is open to the public free of charge.

Presented by Toyota, the silver anniversary of the Kalamazoo Klash is set for August 9, 2017. The Klash was named one of the top 5 short track events in the nation by Speedway Illustrated. Kyle Busch returns to the Klash in 2017 with his sights set on wins in both Kalamazoo Klash XXV and the ARCA/CRA Super Series races. Busch won the ARCA/CRA Super Series race at Kalamazoo Speedway in 2014 and has set his sights on winning both races in 2017. Busch will be driving a Senneker Performance Outlaw Super Late Model for the Klash.

Jake Steele - Chief Director of Track Services

Terry Kizer – Track Services Coordinator

Kizer attended Baker College for a Bachelor degree in business admiration with a minor in accounting. Kizer has served the Alamo Township (the Speedway is located in Alamo Township) Fire Department for 22 years serving as the Fire Chief since 2010. Kizer is certified as Fire Company Officer I & II, Fire Officer III and as a medical first responder. His qualifications also include 15 years in towing and recovery services. Kizer has 28 years in KTS, starting at a young age working for former Speedway owner Marty Jones, his uncle. He quickly advanced and started running and operating the safety crew. Kizer spent 4 years running wreckers with NASCAR for Kansas, Chicago and Michigan speedways.



Jeff Welcher – Track Safety Instructor

Welcher has served in the public safety field for almost 30 years. He is currently a public safety officer for the Plainwell (Allegan County) Department of Public Safety. Additionally, he is a lieutenant with the Gun Plain Township Fire Department along with being the training officer. He attended Kalamazoo Valley Community College studying law enforcement. His training includes attending the Michigan State Police 55th fire investigator school and follow-up arson class, becoming a national board certified fire investigator. His certifications include Firefighter I & II, Fire Company Officer I & II, Fire Officer III, Hazmat operations, and medical first responder. He is completing his Michigan Fire Instructor Certification. His passion for training includes the "play safe! be safe!" fire safety education program for children and several juvenile fire setter programs and interventions. During his career he earned two lifesaving awards for CPR.



Sam Corradini – Track Services Coordinator

Corradini has been in the fire services field for 9 years starting off his career at the Alamo Township Fire Department where he was promoted to lieutenant 2 years ago. During the time he has been at the Department he attended Kalamazoo Valley Community College studying fire science and emergency medical technology. After completion Corradini joined the Kalamazoo County Fire Investigation Response Team in conjunction with the Michigan Arson Prevention Committee and Kalamazoo Valley Community College.
