

KALAMAZOO SPEEDWAY FAST FACTS

fastest 3/8 mile oval in the world

- 🏁 Opened in 1950 – 69 consecutive seasons of racing
- 🏁 Located off US 131 – 10 minutes from Kalamazoo; 40 minutes south of Grand Rapids
- 🏁 Paved 3/8 mile high-banked oval
- 🏁 Paved pit space for 145 cars with trailers/haulers
- 🏁 Seats 6,500 and includes 43 skyboxes (holding 8-16 guests each)
- 🏁 Racing April through September
- 🏁 Designated family seating with no alcohol or smoking (capacity of over 1,000)
- 🏁 Paved accessible parking, modern restrooms and 30 acres of general parking
- 🏁 Top of the line safety equipment staffed by paramedics
- 🏁 Visiting series include the ARCA/CRA Super Series, Winged Super Sprints and the Midwest Compact Touring Series
- 🏁 Special events include the Red, White & Boom, Kalamazoo Klash, the legendary Night of Destruction, Call of the Wild, Super Shoe Nationals and Fireworks
- 🏁 Six unique concession stands, two party decks (capacity of 240 and 100) plus hospitality services for groups up to 500
- 🏁 Proud supporter of numerous local non-profit organizations, schools and churches
