Reserved Pit Stalls

Reserved pit stalls are now available for full time race teams. Bottom pit stalls are \$100 and top pit stalls are \$50 for the full regular season. There are PLENTY of unreserved free spots; however, if drivers have a large enclosed trailer or want more than one stall for a teammate and want the stalls next to each other, you can make that happen. Reserve stalls by visiting the Kalamazoo Speedway winter office (Howe Patio in Plainwell) or call the Speedway office (269) 692-2423.

Discounts!!!

Who doesn't like a bargain? Well have we got some for you! Discounted grandstand passes, pit passes and skybox rentals are available now. Call (269) 692-2423 to purchase yours.

GRANDSTAND PASS

The 10 Punch Grandstand Pass (\$100) is good for 10 - \$12 events. Use any number of punches per visit (e.g., if you bring 4 people, you can use 4 of the punches for that visit). If you attend a \$15 event, simply pay \$3 cash plus one punch.

SEASON PIT PASS

Pit passes may be purchased as a 10 punch (\$275) or 15 punch (\$400) pass. These passes are good for any Kalamazoo Speedway sponsored event during the 2018 season. One punch is good for one day (e.g., three punches would be needed for the 3-day Super Shoe Nationals).

SEASON SKYBOX (8-PERSON)

Rent an 8-person skybox for every Kalamazoo Speedway sponsored event in 2018 (\$3000). No exclusions.


