2018 FWD NATIONALS



Paul Bittle is the 2018 FWD Nationals Champion. Bittle started 14th in the 22 car field (the top four in each of the 'B' features filling in behind him). Sheldon Lindlag led the first few laps of the 25-lap feature while Bittle made quick work of cars in front of him, moving into the second position with 21 laps remaining. Bittle moved into the lead by going around Doug Smith; Todd Metz Jr. had been moving up through the field. The cars remaining for this race appeared unbreakable after a few hard hits, one car bouncing in the air after making contact with the wall and then continuing to race. Corey Woods wasn't as fortunate as his car lost a tire (one of many tires that parted with their cars over the course of the weekend). Metz (the 2017 FWD Nationals Champion) made a race of it but couldn't quite pass Bittle (the 2016 champion) crossing the finish line 0.224 seconds after Bittle. Following Metz was Drew Losey, Smith and Jacob Alexander. The rest of the top 10 included Jeff Sayles, Sheldon Lindlag, Corey Holtzlander, Duane Green and Ryan Osborne.

2018 SUPER SHOE NATIONALS XXXII



Jeff Ganus has had a lot of success at the Zoo this year and ended his season as he began it, with a win, making it two Super Shoe Nationals Championships in a row. Ganus dominated the 50-lap feature in the 22 car field. Starting 14th with rain moving in fast, Rob Hardy had the early lead before giving it up to Rich Boal. Ganus passed Boal with 38 laps remaining. Ganus crossed the finish line 6.483 seconds

ahead of second place finisher Mark Shook, the 2016 Super Shoe Champion, Rich Boal, Billy Shannon and Nick Pressler. Carl Burlingham finished sixth followed by Corey Ryman, Rob Hardy, Andrew Brest and Kevin Sauer. Ganus' car overheated in Victory Lane and the rain started not long after the race ended in a replay of the 2016 Super Shoe when the clouds opened just after the main event finished.
