FRONT WHEEL DRIVE CLASSES

News Flash: All cars competing in the Kalamazoo Speedway front wheel drive classes (Zoo Stocks and Outlaw FWD) must be equipped with front and rear tow hooks, straps or chains. Whichever device a driver elects to use must be simple and strong enough for Speedway personnel to quickly get a hook on a disabled car and safely tow it back to the applicable pit stall. This rule is applicable to drivers who race in the class on a weekly basis as well as visiting drivers. Thank you for your cooperation.

And while we're talking about the Front Wheel Drive classes—here's what the two 2018 track champions have planned for the 2019 season.

Colin Bozell will not be defending his Zoo Stock track championship. Bozell has a new Street Stock ride (right) for this season. Like so many of us, he's looking forward to the start of the season and a new set of challenges. Bozell tried out a Street Stock after the close of last year's racing season and felt good with the change. Sister Valerie ran in the Street Stocks last year but brother and sister won't be competing against one another in 2019 as Valerie will be driving in the Outlaw FWD class. Bozell was the Zoo Stocks' Rookie of the Year last year and is shooting for Rookie of the Year in the Street Stocks this year—and he wouldn't mind picking up a feature win (or more) either.

Outlaw FWD track champion Jason Essex (also Rookie of the Year) will be defending his title this season in a revamped version of the same car (pictured) he drove to the championship last year. Essex will be sporting a different design this year to spotlight sponsor Rev-X, racing as car "X". We'll be assigning a number given the scoring tower has only learned its numbers thus far. Essex will also be racing a second (very sporty) car in the Midwest Compact Touring Series in 2019. His goals for the season are successfully defending his 2018 track championship and adding a championship in the Midwest Compact Touring Series (North).
