TECH BULLETIN - ZOO STOCK CLASS

At the beginning of the season Kalamazoo Speedway established 16.850 as the fastest lap a Zoo Stock could run, reserving the right to adjust the time over the course of the season to help maintain a level playing field. Moving drivers who dip below the established lap time in the Zoo Stocks impacts both the Zoo Stocks and the Outlaw FWDs. The mere size of the Zoo Stock class has sorted slower and/or more inexperienced drivers into a 'B' feature race where recreational and/or those drivers needing to build skills and confidence may race with others possessing comparable skill levels and equipped cars.

Effective immediately, we are adjusting the top lap time for the Zoo Stock class to 16.750. Drivers who have not exceeded this lap speed in 2019 have been reinstated to the Zoo Stock class. Points, payout and race outcomes will not be restored.

Warning! This is NOT an invitation to power up Zoo Stock cars with the idea of overpowering the field. Cars on the bubble will be receiving extra scrutiny in tech and Kalamazoo Speedway will retain its option of moving a driver up to the Outlaw FWD class if the driver's performance exceeds most of the other drivers in the class.

RECAP - JUNE 28



It was Howe Patio & Windows Double Trouble Night with 2 features for each class plus a 20-lap Zoo Stock 'B' feature. The only rain cell in the area decided to check us out and got so excited by the racing that it dropped a little too much of

its load and the track had to be dried. As unwelcome as race night rain is, it was hot enough the rain felt kind of good and the drying brigade got the track dried off quickly.

Matt Elsey Jr. posted quick time (16.866) of the 37 Zoo Stocks that showed up to race. On the second lap of the 18-car, 20-lap 'B' feature, Hannah Zwart (below right) and Jacob Nickoloff (in his first visit) both rolled. Nickoloff and Zwart were fine but their night ended early. Don Porter captured the early lead in the race giving it up to Matt Elsey Sr. (right) who finished out the race in the top spot.








Eighteen cars also ran in the first of two 15-lap features. Tod Watson went hard into the wall and we had our second red flag stop in as many races. When the race went back to green, Tyler Reading (in his second race of the year at the Speedway) went green to checkered holding off a persistent Mason May and Logan Hiemstra. Jorden Brinkert came on fast at the end, finishing third.

In the second feature, 16 cars remained to race and newcomer Mike Reynolds in only his second race at the Speedway, drove from green to checkered in his red PT Cruiser. He was swarmed by Matt Elsey Jr, Matt Majewski, Dillon Rose and Duane Green but fought everyone off. In the end he was disqualified for going 0.026 seconds faster than allowed (see Tech article on page 2), giving the win for the second week in a row to Matt Elsey, Jr. (right). With 7 point races complete Rielly Meade is still on top followed by Jorden Brinkert (-40), Ross Bergman (-51), Jared Blanchard (-107), Logan Hiemstra (-125), Matt Elsey Jr. (-139), Renae Letts (-364), Logan Meade (-382), Kenny Head II (-409) and Chris Bradshaw (-413).

In the Outlaw FWDs 17 cars qualified. Gabe Carr broke the fast time track record (15.040) by 0.003 of a second, his third record this year. In the 15-lap first feature Corey Woods flew from the tail of the field to within striking distance of the leader in a couple of laps then shot out to the lead following the rain delay with Kyle Jansen joining him in outpacing the pack. Gabe Carr came charging toward the front, also from the tail of the field. Carr got around Woods to lead late in the race, but Woods (left) pulled off the victory.

Fourteen cars ran in the second feature. Drew Losey and Adam Van Avery drove 1-2 for the first laps. Gabe Carr was in third when Pete Doxey joined the party and took the lead from Van Avery with 2 laps remaining. Carr and Van Avery gave Doxey a run for his money, but Doxey prevailed. With six point races complete, Corey Woods is the frontrunner followed by Adam Van Avery (-5), Gabe Carr (-59), Pete Doxey (-65), Drew Losey (-119), John Munro (-160), Camille Lewis (-192), John Carr (-200), Nick Layman (-276) and Wayne Stack (-289).

Kyle Ribble maintained his season-long lock by putting up the fastest time (14.815) of the 21 Street Stocks lining up for Double Trouble Night. Matt Corliss in Bubba Brooks #84 outpaced the field in the first 20-lap feature. Brandon Zachary and Tom Rutherford weren't put off by the gap and with 12 to go they'd closed it. Kyle Ribble moved around Zack Cook for fourth. Rutherford made a move to pass Corliss on the outside and took the lead with 5 remaining. Tom Rutherford (left) in his second race at the Speedway this year headed to Victory Lane.

In feature #2, Greg Brown and Zack Cook led the field side by side. Cook shot out to the lead following a caution and Kyle Ribble muscled his way into third. Ribble and Cook were door to door fighting for the lead with Brandon Zachary on their tail. Cook looked to get a bit loose in turn 2 on the final lap but still maintained his edge over Ribble and drove his way into Victory Lane.





With point six races run, it's Kyle Ribble over Brandon Zachary (-24), Zack Cook (-32), Colin Bozell (-179), Shane Miller (-203), Barry Jenkins (-203), Greg Brown (-226), Heath Bronkema (-324), Jerry Zachary (-373) and Doug Gallandt (-374).

Chris Shannon was the fastest qualifier (13.847) over a field of 22 in the Late Model Sportsman. The first 25-lap feature had Chris Garrett and Dylan Stovall take the field to green. Garrett (right) was the frontrunner for the whole race holding off challenges from Stovall, Jon Beach, Chris Shannon and Buddy Head.

In feature #2, Dylan Stovall and Kenny Head led the field to green. Stovall had the early lead before Kenny Head drove into the top spot and maintained the lead despite serious grief being heaped on him by Jon Beach, brother, Buddy with Chris Shannon just waiting for his chance. With under 5 to go, lapped traffic looked like it was going to become a factor. Beach (inside), Kenny Head (next to him), Makena Snyder (lapped car) and Buddy Head on the outside made it four wide as Buddy shot out to the lead with Beach in second. Beach had to settle for second place for the second time tonight and Buddy Head went to Victory Lane.

With eight point races complete it's Buddy Head with a comfortable 112 point lead over Chris Shannon, Chris Garrett (-154), Dylan Stovall (-285), Jeff Bozell (-339), Kenny Head (-369), Ryan Stutz (-391), Keegan Dykstra (-427), Keith Wilfong (-433), Lane Head (-438).
