RECAP: KALAMAZOO KLASH XXVII

Brian Campbell took fast time for the ARCA/CRA Super Series with a time of 31.058 (photo on next page [left]).

The I25 lap ARCA/CRA race was won by Kyle Crump who raced in both the ARCA/CRA race and the Klash. In a race punctuated by more than a few cautions, Brian Campbell retired early in the race and Carson Hocevar had his share of issues, also retiring from the race before its conclusion. Hocevar had the fastest time in practice and both drivers were expected to be contenders. Johnny VanDoorn led for the bulk of the race before Travis Braden led a few laps. VanDoorn and Braden set about trading paint for the lead with about 50 laps remaining; VanDoorn ultimately prevailing in that duel. Crump and VanDoorn exchanged the lead 10 laps later. Crump maintained the lead through a series

of cautions until late in the race when VanDoorn fleetingly took the lead back on a restart. Crump wrested the lead back almost immediately with nine laps to go. Travis Braden finished the race behind Crump, followed by Josh Brock, Hayden Sprague, Logan Runyon, Austin Kunert, Justin Schroeder,

Jordan Dahlke, Trevor McCoy and James Krueger. VanDoorn finished 12th of the 21 car field having left the race with a couple of laps remaining.

Bozell took fast time for Kalamazoo posting a time of 12.889. Nine drivers ran in the 'B' feature, including two first time Klash entrants: Paul lakubik and former Street Stock track champion Zack Cook. Cook showed strong promise having only driven an Outlaw Super Late Model once previously and never at the Zoo. Jakubik had an issue with his car in practice, missed qualifying and ran his back-up car in the feature, not what he had in mind for his first Klash. Kevin Sauer won



the 'B' feature followed across the line by Cook. Sauer (above right) said he came to race and gave up his winnings to start in the main event. He earned the win and got to keep the trophy.

Bozell tossed the dice to set the inversion (value of two dice plus 8) and started in the 17th position. Adam Terry qualified 17th and started on the pole. Two-time Klash winner Tyler Roahrig started the race in the 16th position. Adam Terry immediately took the lead followed by Craig Everage, Doug True, TK Whitman, 2015 Klash winner Jeff Ganus and Monte Tolan. With 20 laps complete, the order of the top five remained the same; with 25 down, 2011 Klash winner Phil Bozell (who also ran in the ARCA/CRA race) moved into the top five. Ganus and Phil Bozell both moved up a spot over the next 10 laps. Following a caution with 87 laps remaining, Adam Terry was out to a fast start and Ganus got around Everage for second place. With 65 laps remaining Terry had a commanding lead over the rest of the field with tight racing for position going on behind him. With 50 laps remaining, 2009 Klash winner Steve Needles had moved to the 5th position with Andy Bozell and both JR and Tyler Roahrig behind him. Tyler Roahrig moved into the top five with 43 to go. A red flag stop caution with 34 to go set up a déjà vu of the Intimidator 100 with Adam Terry and Tyler Roahrig (Terry prevailing).

Terry took the outside with Roahrig on the inside for the restart. Unlike the Intimidator 100, Roahrig got the jump on Terry and won his 3rd consecutive Klash (matching Terry Seeker's feat from 2012-2014). Adam Terry was second followed by Phil Bozell, Steve Needles, JR Roahrig, Andy Bozell, Jeff Ganus, Brian Bergakker, Justin Clougherty and Craig Everage. It was not a good night for the Sennekers: Rick departed with only 12 laps complete and Terry, going for his 6th Klash win, retired after completing 38 laps.
