TOP 10: 2019 OUTLAW FWD


This month we're highlighting the top 10 in the Outlaw FWD. The class saw 51 drivers participate in point racing. The class ran in heat races on 5 nights and raced for points 11 times. Wayne Stack finished in the top 10 for the first time since 2012 and John Munro, a first-time top 10 finisher, earned Most Improved Driver in the class. John Carr stepped into his brother's car for the last point race of the 2018 when Gabe injured (non-racing) himself. This year he drove Gabe's 2018 car, earned Rookie of



the Year and scored a 9th place finish in the overall standings.


Gabe Carr had one fast car in 2019, breaking the Outlaw FWD track record 4 times. He cracked the 14 second mark (14.936) but didn't fare as well during the features, blowing two engines and earning an 8th place finish in the final standings. Camille Lewis was the only woman to place in the top 10 in any of the classes with a 6th place finish and making every race; it's her first time in the top 10. Corey Woods' was wicked fast during races. Galloping to the front during the features, he led the point standings four times over the course of the season. His #57 developed issues after the midpoint of the season and his backup car wasn't quite the car he needed to compete for the championship but he didn't miss a race. Adam VanAvery led the standing five times over the course of the 2019 season. He led by 27 points over Pete Doxey going into season championship night. Due to a rainout of that class's feature the previous week, two features were on the Season Champion night schedule. He gained 10 points over Doxey in qualifying but finished 11th in the first feature giving Doxey (who won the race) a 3 point lead. VanAvery finished 4th in the second feature and -11 for the season in second place. Pete Doxey played catch up all season, unable to join the season until his teaching job out of state finished for the year; he's now moved back to Michigan. He missed opening night and then benefitting from a non-points race when the Compacts were in town on May 3, the class had a BYE on May 10 followed by rainouts on May 17 and May 24. Doxey finished second to Todd Metz Jr. in the second race of the night but won his first championship placing in the top 5 of every race he ran. Val Bozell finished just out of the top 10 in 11th place and didn't miss a point race all season.













