Like many of our teens, Alex Sexton, 14, raced at the Little Kalamazoo Speedway before starting out in a front wheel drive car at an area track. This year he's driving the #9 Street Stock (his first year in a rear wheel drive car) in the same class as older sister, Taylor. Alex says he likes the Street Stock better due to its speed. He's shown he's able to handle the car and he'd like to earn Rookie of the Year in his class.

Taylor Imus, 17, had very successful beginnings while racing at the Little Kalamazoo Speedway. She moved to Kalamazoo Speedway in 2018 when she drove the #30 Zoo Stock and continued her success with a feature win. She moved up to a Street Stock for 2019 and continues in the #30 Street Stock in 2021 running her first race at the Zoo in Raber's Street Stock Rumble and then again this past Friday. Her hope is to bring the car home each night in one piece and take a few checkered flags during the season. Outside of the track she's looking forward to in-person learning for her senior year in high school.

RECAP – JUNE 11, 2021

Despite the heat, 83 drivers across 4 classes showed up to race. The scoreboard seemed to suffer from heatstroke a few times but managed to recover. As the sun got lower in the sky it turned into a nice night.



Will Slaughter took fast time for the Spartan Insulation Zoo Stock clocking in at 16.944. Dennis Mudd, Travis Petto (first time in this car), Aaron Anderson and Will Slaughter won the heat races. Ira Hosner reached the finish line first in the 15-lap Zoo Stock 'B' feature (his second of the season). Kylee Letts was second followed by Nick Ruimveld, Dennis Mudd and Chris Elwell rounding out the top five.

In the 20-lap 'A' feature Eric Mepyans took the early lead with Drew Hosner and Logan Meade bolting out of the pack in hot pursuit. Aaron Anderson took the lead about halfway through the race. Hosner

and Meade continued the pursuit as Will Slaughter joined the party. Anderson (right) outpaced the field and picked up his first win this season. Following him across the finish line was Will Slaughter, Logan Meade, Tyler McGhan, Matthew Elsey, Jr., Ryan Osborne, Eric Mepyans, Keith Dixon, Drew Hosner and Bryson Hosner. Tyler McGhan holds a one point lead over Elsey, Jr.

Dave Leonard, Jr. took fast time in the O'Reilly Auto Parts Outlaw FWDs with a time of 15.315 and went on to win the 25-lap feature, his second of the season. Sheldon Lindlag and Will Slaughter won the heat races. John Munro took the lead until about 5 laps in when Will Slaughter made the pass for the lead. With 13 laps showing on the tower, Slaughter left the track in a cloud of smoke after making contact with the wall. Dave Leonard, Jr. who had been trying to get around Slaughter, assumed the lead with Drew Losey, Jake Doxey and Pete Doxey in pursuit. Jake Doxey and Drew Losey narrowed the gap but Dave Leonard, Jr. (right) took the checked flag. He was followed by Jake Doxey, Drew Losey, Pete Doxey (confusing us all by not piloting his usual #28), John Munro, Camille Lewis, Tyler McGhan, Nick Failing, Logan Hiemstra and Jorden Brinkert. Will Slaughter has the point lead by 23 points over Drew Losey.





Mike Brooks was fast qualifier (14.847) in the SS Auto Pro's of Grand Rapids Street Stock and later won the 30-lap feature, his third this season. Two 10-car heat races created mini-feature experiences with DJ Oxford and Brandon Zachary taking the wins there. Multiple lead changes occurred throughout the race. At the half-way point, Matt Corliss was in the lead before Brandon Zachary raced to the lead. Brooks was making his move and was door to door with Zachary, both in pursuit of Corliss. Both Zachary and Corliss spun with under five laps to go. Corliss left the race leaving Brooks and Zachary to duke it out. The race finished with



Brooks getting to the finish line first followed by Zachary, Matt Weenink, Greg Brown and Andy Rutherford completing the top five. In the second half of the order it was Taylor Sexton, Ricky LaDuke, Budd Hybels, Barry Jenkins and Jerry Ballard. Brooks (above) was racing in the Template Late Models feature so we caught up with him in his pit stall after the races. Brandon Zachary is the point leader with newcomer Matt Weenink training by 21 points.



Nick Pressler took fast time (13.923) in the Hutcherson Construction Template Late Models. Mike Brooks and Eric McGlothlen won the heat races. Chris Shannon picked up his third win of the season in the 35-lap feature race. Cory Pressler took the early lead with A.J. Foote moving into the lead with 30 laps remaining. Mike Brooks moved into the lead for a short time before Foote resumed the lead. Chris Shannon had been moving up through the field and Kenny Head, having his best race of the season, were right there. It looked like Foote might make it to the checkered still in the lead when his car blew

causing a red stop caution. Chris Shannon took the checkered followed by Kenny Head, Nick Pressler, Brandon Lyons and Buddy Head in the top five. The bottom half of the order was Dylan Stovall, Makena Snyder, A.J. Foote, Jerry Jansen and Cory Pressler (not all having completed the race). Chris Shannon remains the point leader in the class with Nick Pressler 22 behind him.
