



Following a caution, Jeff Ganus (starting 12th) made his move around both Andrew Brest and Stutz for the lead. Zack Cook (starting 14th) made his own moves and while he got a nose up on Ganus at one point, Ganus was able to open enough daylight that Cook couldn't catch him. Jeff Ganus adds a second Super Shoe Nationals' title to his prestigious resume. Cook finished second followed by Andrew Brest, Nick Pressler and TK Whitman rounding out the top five. The second half of the order started with Adam Terry followed by Corey Ryman, Cole Allers, Ryan Stutz and Tony Chapman.
