Without a doubt, Bentley Foote is our youngest driver weighing in at 9 years old (he won't be 10 until December!)



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Bentley honed his racing skills driving a mini wedge for 3 years before moving up to the big leagues this year. May 26 was his first start in the big leagues and he drove his #88 Zoo Stock to Victory Lane in the Zoo Stock B feature.

Dakara Williams, 14, unlike Bentley, has no racing experience, says step dad, Dan Rigoni, "she'd never even driver a lawn mower." Dakara has a passion for racing and in her second start, won her heat race. For 2023 she plans to work at improving her skills and becoming more consistent.



## JUNE 2 RACE RECAP

It was another great night of racing at Kalamazoo Speedway. All four weekly classes raced plus the Michiana Vintage Racers were on hand to show off their stuff.


In the Hutcherson Construction Late Models Billy Shannon (at right rolling the dice for the inversion) was back on top of the fast-time leaderboard, 13.960 second, 96.705 mph. TC Burgess shot to the front for a lap before Rick Senneker led for the next quarter of the 40-lap race. Chris Shannon made his move to the lead at about the half-way point with Jeff Bozell, Dylan Stovall and a late charging Luke Krick putting up challenges. At the checkered it was

Construction. Luke Krick was the runner-up followed by Dylan Stovall, Buddy Head and Jeff Bozell finishing in the top five. Billy Shannon led the second half of the order followed by David Guarino, Bill Tomlinson, Rick Senneker and Ryan Stutz, all finishing on the lead lap. Defending champion Billy Shannon is the point leader with Jeff Bozell trailing by only 32.

Some drivers pace before their feature, others sit quietly in their car, some talk with fellow drivers or crew. Bryce Bozell, age 11, (left) was so chill he caught some

quick shut eye before hurtling around the track at over 90 miles per hour. (He finished the race in 11<sup>th</sup> place on the lead lap).

Kyle VanSparrentak (below tossing the dice) posted a 14.894 second lap (90.641) mph in the Techworks Trailer Sales Street Stock, a good start toward the \$2,000 to win purse compliments of

Randy's Trucking. Norm Overhiser won

the nine car Last Chance race. Also advancing to the 35-lap feature were Gabe Carr, Danny Oxford and Jerry Ballard. Blake Hybels, 16, took the early lead and put a lot of pavement between his #17 and the rest of the field which was nose-to-tail and door-to-door. Caution flew with 19 laps remaining when Jeff Town had a tire go down. On the restart Lee Slaton took the lead with Alex Sexton, 16, pressuring. Three cautions flew in two laps and both Slaton and Sexton retired with 14 laps remaining. Now it was Ricky LaDuke and Brock Ganus at the head of the pack with LaDuke in front. With six laps remaining, Ganus pulled ahead. At the checkered it was Brock Ganus (below right), runner-up Ricky LaDuke, Kyle Ribble, Austin Maynard and Brandon Zachary in the top five. Kyle VanSparrentak, Gabe

Tristan Crago and Zach
Westdorp completed
the top 10. Kyle

In the O'Reilly Auto Part Outlaw FWD it was Matthew Elsey Jr. taking all the top honors. Elsey Jr. (right, with family) was the fast qualifier with a time of 15.275 (88.380 mph) and won the \$500 purse (spansored by Honor Credit Union) by winning the 25-lap feature. Bryan Gates led lap one, Rodney Russell II led lap two and then it was Elsey Jr. leading until the checkered flag waved. Before the feature began, Nick Layman's #5 suffered a broken axle during qualifying. Father, Ira Hosner, and son, Drew, both qualified but Drew's high school graduation was on race night (the scheduling nerve!!) and didn't make it back in time for the feature. Drew, third in the points, going into the night, slipped to 8th. Dave Leonard Jr. was the runner-up in the race, followed by Rodney Russell II (right), Dan Rigoni and Brvan Gates. Dillon Rose and Rvan Diamond were  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$ (having graduated from the Zoo Stock earlier in the evening), followed by Wayne Stack, Brad Ingle and Jake Doxey. Matthew Elsey Jr. has a commanding point lead. Dave Leonard Jr. also ran in the Street Stock feature and skipped Victory Lane to get buckled into his Street Stock car.



The <mark>Spartan Insulation Zoo Stock</mark> paid \$400 to win (compliments of Randy's Trucking) for the 'A' feature. Ryan Diamond, back after sitting out 2 races for dipping under the Zoo Stock fastest time allowed, posted fast time (16.813, 80.295 mph). Dillon

Rose, also back under the same circumstances, was the second fastest with a time of 16.836. New this year, if a driver dips under 16.700 for TWO laps during the night, they will sit out 2 events before being able to run in the Zoo Stock in 2023.

The 'B' feature was won by JJ Brooks. Anthony Foote, 12, and Terry Kline were the runner-up and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finisher respectively. Tyler Vanderhoff darted out to the lead in the 20-lap feature. With 12 laps remaining the #27 of Matthew Elsey Jr. took the lead and put up a huge lead. With 2 laps remaining a caution was tossed. Ryan Diamond made the most out of this



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and took the lead, crossing the finish line first. Unfortunately, he again dipped below the maximum allowable speed and was disqualified. Dillon Rose suffered the same fate. That made Matthew Elsey Jr. the winner, followed by Mason Metzger, 11, and Matt Elsey Sr. as the top three. CJ French and Mason May rounded out the top five. Charles Anderson came in sixth followed by defending champion Logan Meade, Eric Mepyans, Desmond Watkins and Nick Ruimveld. Elsey Jr. pulled into Victory Lane so his car could bask in its glory while he darted off (with helmet still on) to the make ready chute to buckle into his Outlaw FWD car (photo previous page).

#### **OUTLAW SUPER LATE MODEL (OSLM)**

- Left Side Weight Rule. Nothing more than 60.000%.
- Tread Width. Maximum 83" tread width. This will be checked with toe plates and will be measured at 1" above the concrete surface.
- Tire Program. All 4 race tires will be purchased at the track the day of the race and these tires will remain impounded, until they are released. You may purchase practice tires or bring in your own.
