

Over the next month, AutoMODIFIED offers its last three open drifting events of the 2023 season. First up is the October 14 event (followed by October 28 and November 11). AutoMODIFIED will be back in 2024 for another full season. The track goes hot from 2:00 PM through 9:00 PM (drifting under the lights). Pit passes are \$20 for non-drivers. Drivers are always happy to talk about their car and their sport—and some offer ride-a-longs. Drifting is a rain or shine event. Grandstands are \$5 for adults; no charge for 12 and under. 


