JUNE 9 🖘 THE INTIMIDATOR 100 RECAP

Features. Features. Features. Just like Super Shoe Sunday! Under awesome weather, a great Landscape Forms Intimidator 100 was run for the Outlaw Super Late Models with similarly competitive races run by the Late Models, Street Stock and Outlaw FWDs.

Let's start our recap with the O'Reilly Auto Parts Outlaw FWD. Matthew Elsey Jr. qualified in the top spot of the 17 drivers who showed up to race with a 15.092 (89.451 MPH). Ira Hosner led the first lap of the 25-lap feature. Bryan Gates led until 19 laps remained when Rodney Russell II (starting 14th in the red #11 car) drove into the lead. Matthew Elsey Jr., as he'd done all year, raced out to the lead with 16 laps remaining but then developed mechanical issues and retired to the pits for repairs before rejoining the field. Dave Leonard Jr. (in the #33) gave Russell a run for his money as did Jake Doxey (#70) but in the end it was Rodney Russell II (below left) taking the checkered flag for his



first win of the season. Dave Leonard Jr. (center below right) was the runner-up followed by Jake Doxey (on the left), Nick Layman and Caitlin Tomlinson; all finishers in the top five. Bryan Gates was at the top of the second half of the order followed by Nolan Gross, Chris Elwell, Nick Ruimveld then Matthew Elsey Jr. 10 laps down in the 10th position. The remaining seven drivers, like Elsey Jr., experienced an evening that didn't go according to plan. Matthew Elsey Jr. has the point lead.

Jeremy Young was the fastest driver (15.131 seconds) in the Techworks Trailer Sales Street Stock practice session. Kyle VanSparrentak was the fastest in qualifying (15.057, 89.659 MPH). This was the 3rd (of six) "Big Money" nights sponsored by Performance Plus Auto & Fabrication. Jeff Town and Chad VanSparrentak led the 20-car field to green in the 35-lap feature. Jeff Town led the first few laps before a caution that ended his night. Chad VanSparrentak took over the lead with Gabe Carr and Austin Maynard in hot pursuit. Ricky LaDuke, who started in the 8th starting position had worked his way up and was challenging Maynard with 25 laps remaining. The #68 of Kyle



VanSparrentak, starting in the 11th position had made it into the top five by that time with Kyle Ribble also in the mix. Ricky LaDuke looked like he was going to get by Maynard, but Maynard's car was stronger through turns 3 and 4 and he hung on for his first win of the season. In the runner-up position was defending champion Ricky LaDuke, followed by Kyle VanSparrentak, Kyle Ribble and Jeremy Young wrapping up the top five. Alex Sexton led off the second half of the order followed by Colin Bozell, Zach Westdorp, Curtis Towne, and Chad VanSparrentak. Kyle VanSparrentak has the point lead.



In the Hutcherson Construction Late Models, Billy Shannon put up the fastest lap in practice (14.220) and Buddy Head was at the top of the scoring tower in qualifying with a time of 13.948 (96.788 MPH). Jorden Brinkert led the first few laps of the 20-car, 40-lap feature before Taylor Sexton moved into the lead and held off challengers. Luke Krick (starting 8th) wanted the checkered flag more than usual as it was his birthday. Kenny Head (starting 14th) wanted the flag to honor his step-son, Ben Raber who passed away 5 years ago to the day. Buddy Head, well, he always wants the



win, it doesn't matter the day. Krick moved past Sexton with 16 laps remaining. Kenny Head came on strong throughout the race. Buddy Head tried but just couldn't get around Krick. Luke Krick got his birthday wish, multi-time track champion Buddy Head was the runner-up with 4-time track champion Kenny Head finishing third ahead of Rick Senneker and Chris Shannon. Lane Head finished in the sixth position, followed by Jeff Bozell, Taylor Sexton, Bill Tomlinson and Nathan Koester, in his first start at Kalamazoo Speedway this season. Luke Krick has the point lead over defending champion Billy Shannon (towed off the oval early in the race) by 16.

And then it was time for the 20 Outlaw Super Late Models to run the 23rd Intimidator 100, sponsored by Landscape Forms. Mark Shook was the fastest in practice with a lap speed of 12.719. Brian Bergakker took fast-time in singlecar qualifying with a speed of 12.567 (106.140 MPH). Bergakker had someone else throw the dice for the inversion (roll of two dice plus six) resulting in his starting 17th in the field. This was no single file, no lead change sort of race. Early in the race, it was the #44 Landscape Forms



sponsored car of Zack Cook commanding the lead. Two time Outlaw champion Todd Harrington, Rick Senneker and former champion Adam Terry followed Cook while the race was still early. Terry got around Senneker 20 laps into the race and Harrington got around Cook with 67 laps remaining. Adam Terry had the lead by the half way point and put up a substantial lead. With 35 laps remaining the yellow flew. Adam Terry was back out to the lead on the restart with Harrington on his tail and the #19 of TK Whitman pursuing. Brian Bergakker appeared in the top five following the caution and started picking off the competition. With three-quarters of the race complete Bergakker had only Terry ahead of him. Terry had a substantial lead but Bergakker began cutting into it, making the pass with 10 laps remaining. Caution flew late in the race for debris in turn one but Bergakker took the green with a strong restart. At the checkered it was Brian Bergakker, Adam Terry and former champions Mark Shook, Phil Bozell and Andy Bozell. The second half of the order started with Todd Harrington followed by TK Whitman, Buddy Gray, Matt Frazier and Monte Tolan wrapping up the top 10.
