We kind of liked the headliner qualifying at the start of the race program so we did it again with the 4J Trucking Modifieds. Leslie Stuller sang the National Anthem and we were off to the races.

Walt Obrinske Jr. clocked fast time for the 20 4J Trucking Modifieds with a time of 13.841 (97.536 MPH) and also had the fastest time in practice (13.868). Brad Blackburn Jr. (right) hit the wall hard during practice and was done for the night.

In the 50-lap feature, the #65 of Austin Maynard took the early lead. Jeff Ganus began his march through the field after a caution with 47 laps remaining. Ganus passed Maynard with 34 laps remaining and put up a substantial lead. A caution with 31 laps remaining equalized the field. Matt Maurer made the most of the restart and moved into the third position. A couple more cautions followed in quick succession before getting back to green. With 30 laps remaining Jeff Ganus had the lead followed by Austin Maynard, Matt Maurer and Jason Timmerman. Maurer moved into second with 27 laps left. Brian Bergakker came alive during the second half of the race. A caution with five laps remaining gave Matt Maurer the







opening he was looking for and he took the lead on the restart, but it was Ganus's night and Maurer was back in the runner-up position with two laps remaining. At the checkered it was Jeff Ganus (previous page bottom right), Brian Bergakker, Matt Maurer, Matt Dimit and Jason Timmerman in the top five. Once back to green, Lonnie Saumier took a turn leading the pack while Zach Westdorp, from the 4th starting position, moved into the lead with 23 laps remaining. Danny Oxford moved up to second. Ricky LaDuke had cracked the top five at the same time with Kyle Ribble and Kyle VanSparrentak not far behind. With 14 laps left, LaDuke swept past Westdorp and posted a substantial lead over the rest of the field. Point leader Kyle VanSparrentak moved around 4th place Danny Oxford with 8 laps remaining and then into the runner-up position with 4 laps left in the race.
