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#### AUGUST 5 \*\* RACE RECAP


We beat the rain and every race was completed, but it couldn't have been closer!! Unfortunately that meant that Victory Lane for most of the features was suspended to make sure we beat the rain. Drivers who want a Victory Lane photo may make arrangements to have one taken prior to the August 11 races.

Michael Sullins was fast qualifier with a time of 17.426 seconds for the Crown Vics. He (right) went on to win the heat race as well. In the 12-lap feature, Jerry Osterhouse took the checkered flag. Michael Sullins was the runner-up followed by John Osterhouse, Hannah Zwart and Jake Hopwood completing the top five. Sorry, no Victory Lane photos due to rain moving in.

Fast qualifier for the Spartan Insulation Zoo Stock was Nick Failing with a time of 16.509 seconds. Failing won one of the four heat races and also the \$1,000 to win 'A' feature, commenting that it had been a while since he'd had a win at Kalamazoo Speedway. True that! Terry Kline (bottom right), John Rupe and Leonard Diamond won the other heats. Austin McKee added another 'B' feature win to his resume. The last race of the night and with sprinkles falling, Victory Lane was back open. Bailey Pauwels and Roger Hensley skipped their Victory Lane celebration but finished second and third, respectively, in the 'B' feature. Noah Thomson and Robert Metheny Sr. completed the top five. Honorably mention goes to Don Teadt who came in sixth in the 12 car field. The 20-lap 'A' feature began with a complete restart and within a few laps the Zoos thought they were the Street Stock going threewide and nose to tail. Nick Failing was the beneficiary of hard racing and took the lead with 14 laps remaining. A couple more cautions marred the race but the last 12 laps were caution free with Failing earning the checkered flag followed by Ryan Diamond, Rielly Meade, Matthew Elsey Jr. and Jorden Brinkert in the top five. The second half of the order started with Dylan Hoppes, followed by Ed Clawson, Charles Anderson, Mason May and Terry Kline, all finishing on the lead lap. This was not a point race.

For the O'Reilly Auto Parts Outlaw FWDs, Matthew Elsey Jr. put up a fast time of 15.210 (88.757) who went on to win the heat race. Curtis Edney Jr. led the first lap of the 15-lap feature, then Nick Layman took a turn. Edney Jr. took it back in short order before Will Slaughter laid claim to the lead. Matthew Elsey Jr. was moving up through the field when he headed to the pits . At the end it was Will Slaughter claiming the checkered flag and the \$1,000 to win purse, Dan Rigoni was the runner-up followed by fellow lead lap finishers Ira Hosner and Curtis Edney Jr. This was not a point race.

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Ricky LaDuke (15.039) was fastest in practice and Kyle Ribble was tops in qualifying with a time of 14.896, 90.628 MPH for the Techworks Trailer Sales Street Stock. In the heat race, it was Danny Oxford (below left) taking the checkered flag. Ricky LaDuke drove to the lead within a few laps in the \$1,000 to win, 30-lap feature. Kyle Ribble gave LaDuke some competition; both distancing themselves from the rest of the field by almost half the

length of the track. In the end, LaDuke (bottom left) took the checkered flag and Ribble was the runnerup. Gabe Carr was third followed by Zach Westdorp and Danny Oxford wrapping up the top five and the cars finishing on the lead lap. This was not a point race for the Street Stock.





Bob Mitchell (Wisconsin) qualified at the top of the Kalamazoo Speedway Big Rigs field (18.554); Austin Hoppe (Wisconsin) was fastest in practice (18.753). Mitchell and Hoppe were two of the three drivers who brought their own trucks to run; the rest of the still growing fleet is owned by Kalamazoo Speedway. Steve Roden (Allegan) won one of the heats with Austin Hoppe winning the second. Steve Roden gave Hoppe a challenge in the

25-lap feature but finished in the runner-up position. Bob Mitchell finishing third followed by Mike Morgan (Tennessee) and our own Tim Gale wrapping up the top five.
